

## *WELCOME TO MARINE CORPS BASE QUANTICO, CROSSROADS OF THE CORPS*

Since its establishment in 1917, Quantico has been home to many of the nation's most innovative, intelligent and patriotic men and women. It is here, at the Crossroads of the Marine Corps, that vital concepts, training and equipment of the future are developed. Some of the most important techniques in warfighting were born here, including expeditionary warfare, for which the Marine Corps is renowned. History has proven the importance of Quantico to America's defense. The sharp vision and intense dedication of the service members, civilians and family members who serve here will continue to ensure the Marine Corps remains the world's premier fighting force.

### *MISSION*

"To optimize readiness by providing operational and training support, infrastructure, and community services that are responsive to Marine Corps Base, MCCDC and tenant requirements, and the needs of our military members, families and civilians within a safe and secure environment."

### *VISION*

# HISTORY OF MARINE CORPS BASE QUANTICO

Spaniards visited Quantico 40 years before Jamestown was settled and Captain John Smith explored the Potomac banks in 1608. Tobacco was the main product of early Scottish settlers in the Quantico area, which was the home of many Revolutionary War heroes. American, British and French armies used nearby roads to move from one battlefield to another. During the Civil War, Confederates used the Potomac's banks as gun positions to halt Union traffic on the river. By the 1880s, the land had been acquired by speculators who sold it to the Corps in 1917.

The commandant of the Marine Corps established Marine Barracks, Quantico on May 14, 1917. Thousands were trained during World War I, including units of the 4th Marine Brigade. In 1920, Marine Corps Schools was founded (in the words of then chief of staff for Quantico, Col. Smedley D. Butler) to "make this post and the whole Marine Corps a great university."

Prospects of a Pacific War in the 1920s showed a need for revolutionary new tactics and hardware. The techniques of amphibious warfare were conceived and perfected here. Marines at the predecessor of today's Marine Corps Systems Command designed equipment to ensure successful amphibious operations. Quantico aviators developed close-air support tactics to aid troops on the ground.

The Caribbean "Banana Wars" tested new tactics and equipment developed at Quantico. The tactical units carrying out the new amphibious

operations became the Fleet Marine Force in 1935. The FMF, headquartered at Quantico, perfected equipment and techniques in anticipation of its Pacific role. When the headquarters of the FMF left in 1941, Quantico's main task became the education of individual Marines rather than unit training.

Amphibious warfare techniques, developed here in the years before World War II, made victory possible in that conflict's Pacific theater. Quantico trained 15,000 lieutenants and numerous officers from other services, who were leaders in that victory.

In 1947, Quantico Marines conceived of carrying troops from ship to shore by helicopter and formed a special squadron to test the idea, Marine Helicopter Squadron One, commonly referred to as HMX-1. The helicopter techniques they used here later proved invaluable during the Korean and Vietnam wars. More recently, Quantico played a large part in the development of VSTOL aircraft and amphibious assault ships.

Quantico's small, but vital air facility and HMX-1 continue to aid in development, training and education, as well as their most visible duty, support of the president of the United States.

Jan. 1, 1968, the base was redesignated the Marine Corps Development and Education Command in the spirit of the command motto, "Semper Progredi" — always forward.

During the summer of 1987, Quantico planners studied more effi-



cient and streamlined ways in which MCDEC could ensure the Marine Corps' Marines of the future would be the best trained, best led, best disciplined and best equipped. Nov. 10, 1987, the Marine Corps Combat Development Command was created, cementing Quantico's central role in developing concepts, plans, doctrine, training and equipment for the 21st century Marine Corps.

From the combat development process emerged other organizations that either stood alone or fell under the MCCDC umbrella. Marine Corps University was established in 1989 to provide the structure and policy for professional military education Corpswide. Marine Corps Systems Command, which is now a part of the newly activated Materiel Command in Albany, Ga., was also born from MCCDC.

The 1990s were a great time of growth for Quantico. In 1995, the base became home to one of the Corps' most forward-thinking organizations, the Marine Corps Warfighting Laboratory. The lab's mission is to conduct experimentation in 21st century warfare. Wargames and experiments produce new tactics and technologies to make the Marine warfighter more capable.

Additionally the United States military,

particularly the Marine Corps, began to play a greater role in peacekeeping and humanitarian assistance operations. The Department of Defense established the Joint Non-Lethal Weapons Directorate in 1997 to provide the

Corps of the future.

With so many diverse yet intricately woven units, it is appropriate that Quantico is called the Crossroads of the Marine Corps. This is perhaps the only command whose mission

military with greater flexibility in dealing with the challenges of Military Operations Other Than War.

Quantico is also home to the lifeline and pipeline of the Corps. In 1998, Headquarters Marine Corps moved Manpower and Reserve Affairs and Marine Corps Recruiting Command to Quantico from the Navy Annex in Arlington. M&RA has administrative responsibility for all issues related to Marines, their families and quality of life. Recruiting Command ensures young men and women are enlisted to secure the health of the Marine

touches the farthest reaches of the Corps; decisions made here impact Marines aboard ship, fighting in the Global War on Terrorism, on guard duty at embassies across the globe and reserve duty throughout the United States.

Quantico Marines continue to answer the call to threats against the United States and provide security and logistical assistance to the National Capitol Region.

Commands aboard Quantico put their training and technologies, developed during peacetime, to work to provide the best support for the war on terrorism.

# ARRIVAL



## *DIRECTIONS*

Quantico is conveniently accessed by Interstate 95 and there are two airports nearby: Dulles International in Centreville, Va., and Ronald Reagan Washington National in Washington, D.C. Other transportation includes a bus terminal in nearby Triangle as well as Amtrak 800-872-7245 and Virginia Railway Express 800-RIDE-VRE train services.

## *REPORTING IN*

All Marines reporting in during normal working hours, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, check in at the Installation Personnel Administration Center at Headquarters and Service Battalion on Barnett Avenue. Phone number: 703-784-4466.

If arriving after duty hours, check in with the Area Officer of the Day located at Headquarters and Service Battalion, Building 2006. Phone number: 703-784-2261.

Navy personnel report to the Navy Personnel Office annotated in their orders; after hours arrivals will report to the information desk in the Naval Medical Clinic. Phone number: 703-784-1699.

## *LODGING AND HOUSING*

### **Crossroads Inn**

The Crossroads Inn offers “home away from home” accommodations: 78 comfortable rooms, 24 two-room suites and 42 efficiencies. For those traveling with small children there is a playground onsite. Since no pets are allowed, the front desk can provide information about local kennels. All ranks are welcome. For reservations, call 800-965-9511.

### **Family Housing**

The Family Housing Office located in the Family Center, 13201 Perkins St., offers on-base privatized housing and off-base referral services. Quantico homes feature three- and four-bedroom accommodations. Service members are placed into housing according to rank, number of family members, Exceptional Family Member Program status and home availability. Service members must send a housing application (DD Form 1746) accompanied with a copy of detachment orders, completed sex offender and pet disclosures to the Family Housing office, government staff in order to be placed on the appropriate waiting list prior to reporting in. If a member has reported aboard, he or she must present a copy of the reporting endorsement, or a memorandum for housing purposes only.

The date of detachment from the previous duty station is used to establish the effective control date for the waiting list, provided application is made within 30 calendar days after officially reporting aboard, and will also be used when checking in for housing purposes only. Call 703-784-2711 (DSN 278).

A Public-Private Venture Partnership was formed in October 2003 to redevelop the housing inventory aboard Quantico. The homes on the base are now owned and professionally managed by Lincoln Military Housing (LMH). Once housing applications are processed by the Family Housing Office, homes are then offered and leased by the LMH staff. Leases are required with a minimum six-month commitment, and a 30-day written notice is required prior to the date quarters are vacated.

The Traffic Management Branch, located at 2009 Zeilin Rd. on the 2nd floor, provides assistance with government travel and movement of personal property. The office is closed daily 12:30 to 1 p.m. and all government holidays.

## **REGISTRATION**

### **Vehicles**

To register your vehicle: Every person who is attempting to register, reregister or update their vehicle registration must provide proof of valid insurance, valid state registration, drivers license and military identification card or your DOD CAC. If you are under the Age of 26 you must provide a copy of the Drivers Improvement Certificate.

A link is provided to obtain drivers improvement class on Marine Net, [www.marinenet.usmc.mil](http://www.marinenet.usmc.mil). Take a few moments to enroll and on the left menu bar go to browse course catalog. Click on annual training; Click Drivers Improvement; Click on Driving for Life; at the lower right hand corner is an icon to enroll in the course. Complete the course print the certificate and bring it in with the rest of your documents.

All personnel who work or live aboard base who are registering motorcycles must provide their Motorcycle Safety Card to register their motorcycle. A motorcycle is considered any two- or three-wheeled, motorized vehicle over 50cc.

If you are attempting to register a vehicle on base that is not registered to you then you must provide a notarized letter stating that you are the authorized driver of the vehicle and

that you are also shown on the insurance card for the vehicle. On the notarized letter you must provide an adequate description of the vehicle to include: year, make, model, and Vehicle Identification Number (VIN).

For Military personnel and DOD personnel it is a good reminder that when you receive a new ID card/CAC when they expire, it is time to update the base registration on your vehicle.

Hours of Operation: Monday – Friday, 7 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.; closed on national holidays. Early and unscheduled closings are posted on the main page of the MCB Quantico Web site. For more information, call 703-784-2800.

### **Pets**


To register your pet on base you must provide the shot record for the animal; microchip information; verification of the breed of pet; and your military ID. If your pet is a mixed breed animal you must provide a document from a vet identifying the majority breed of you animal. Upon completion of the registration of your pet at the Provost Marshal's Office, you will be provided documentation of registration which needs to be provided to Lincoln Housing Office. For additional information, call 703-784-2800.

### **Weapons**

All persons who live on base are required to register weapon(s) with the Provost Marshal Office at the Vehicle Registration Office prior to bringing the weapon(s) onto the installation. To register your weapon you will need to provide the following information for each weapon as it applies to that weapon: Serial Number, Weapon Type, Make, Model, Caliber, Barrel Length, Action, Year Made, Date Purchased and Description. For additional information, call 703-784-2800.

### **Fingerprints**

Fingerprinting services are offered to service members, dependents and government civilian employees. Priority goes to active-duty service members, reservists, civilian employees and military family members, respectively. The fingerprinting service includes the fingerprinting of persons using a digital scanner and the printing of the fingerprint cards for the individual. The units and personnel are responsible for bringing in two copies of the FD258 (blue fingerprint card). Please do not fill out the fingerprint card. The person helping you will use the computer to complete the information on the fingerprint card. For questions or additional information, call 703-784-2800.



# SERVICES



## *AMERICAN RED CROSS*

The American Red Cross is a private, non-profit organization whose mission is to help people prevent, prepare for and respond to emergencies.

When military members and their families experience emergencies such as the death or illness of a loved one or the birth of a child, the American Red Cross is here to provide emergency communications, access to financial assistance, and other services 24 hours a day. ## *BANKING*

Bank of America has a branch office located in the Marine Corps Exchange Mall. Weekday hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. A 24-hour banking machine is located outside the mall. Call 703-630-1775 for more information.

Marine Federal Credit Union operates three full-service branches and more than 13 ATMs in the Quantico area. MFCU's main office, complete with drive-up ATM and safe deposit boxes, is located on Russell Road near the Exchange Service Station and Package Store. The Basic School Branch is located on the ground floor of O'Bannon Hall, 703-640-7505.

Navy Federal Credit Union accountholders won't have to travel far to conduct banking transactions. A new location recently opened just south of Marine Corps Base Quantico on U.S. Route 1. ### CAR RENTAL

### CAREER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT CENTER

The Career Resource Management Center manages the Transition Assistance Program which provides career/employment assistance, vocational guidance, and transition information to retiring or separating military personnel and their family members. Job search training, personal improvement workshops and individual counseling are provided. The center has an automated national job bank and takes part in local and regional job fairs.

Additionally, the center features the Family Member Employment Assistance Program offers an array of employment assistance. It can help you with constructing a resume, job searches, labor market information, employer contacts and employment referral. ### CHILD, YOUTH & TEEN PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

#### Child Development Services

Located at 3311 Purvis Road, Child Development Services offers three types of child care: full-day care for children ages 13 months to 5 years, part-day preschool for ages 3 to 5, and hourly care. The hourly-care program provides care for children 6 weeks to 5 years of age on a space-available basis. Reservations can be made up to two weeks in advance. Classrooms accommodate children according to their chronological age, developmental age, and any special needs. The CDC is

DOD, National Association for the Education of Young Children certified, with a USDA sponsored program that ensures your child receives healthy nutritional meals. #### Family Child Care Program

Family Child Care providers are family members who are certified by the Command to provide childcare in family housing units aboard Quantico. All providers are screened and trained to ensure our parents and children are provided the highest quality care. FCC homes offer care in a small, family-type setting. Each FCC home is unique in its own way, providing parents with a wide selection of home care settings from which to choose. Full-time care from 6 weeks up to 12 years is available through FCC. However, when an infant in a FCC home reaches the age of 13 months they are eligible for full-time care at the Child Development Center. #### Youth and Teen

The Youth Center, located at 3312 Purvis Road, has become a focal point for youth activities aboard Marine Corps Base Quantico. The youth and teen program is affiliated with The Boys and Girls Club of America and offers a variety of activities for children ages 6-18. The program instills a sense of belonging, usefulness, influence, and competence by providing the young people with one-on-one relationships with caring, adult professionals and fun, age-appropriate, well-rounded programming. The Consolidated Substance Abuse Counseling Center provides assessments, outpatient treatment and referrals to residential

programs and/or community resources. The center also offers information and classes on a wide variety of alcohol and other drug-related topics, to include early intervention and substance abuse control officer training. Services are available to active duty, retirees, and their family members 18 years and older, as well as to civilian employees working aboard Quantico on a space-available basis. ### **EDUCATION AND SCHOOLS**

#### **Dependent Elementary and Secondary Schools**

On-base education is provided to children of military families who live in base housing. The Virginia Domestic Dependent Elementary and Secondary School System is operated by the Department of Defense. The Commonwealth of Virginia and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools accredit the three elementary schools and one middle/high school at Quantico. All teachers are certified. #### **School Liaison**

The mission of the School Liaison is to utilize community based resources to enhance the academic learning environment of military school age children as they navigate the transitions unique to the military lifestyle.

The School Liaison partners with the command staff, MCCS Marine and Family Services Division, and the local school community to address educational issues that involve Quantico's military children. The School Liaison acts as the communication link between the installation, Marine and Family Service programs, the military family and the surrounding school districts.

Transitional services include information

and referral to ease the move from one educational setting to another. The School Liaison may further assist the military school age child by facilitation problem solving and providing education to the parents, schools and command so that they may better advocate for the needs of the military child.



#### **Lifelong Learning Education Center**

The Lifelong Learning Education Center supports all phases of off-duty education, from obtaining a GED to graduate degrees. The center is staffed with highly qualified counselors who offer guidance and assistance in all aspects of continuing education, financial aid, military transcripts, and Veterans Administration education benefits. The learning center is also a testing site for SAT, ACT, CLEP, Dantes, and all military classification tests. ### **EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM**

The Exceptional Family Member Program is a mandatory enrollment program for active duty personnel who have authorized family members with diagnosed medical and/or educational conditions. The primary goal of the program is to ensure that military sponsors are assigned to locations where services exist to support their Exceptional Family Member (spouse, child, stepchild, adopted child, foster child, or a dependent parent) residing with the sponsor who may require special medical or educational services based upon a diagnosed physical, intellectual or emotional hardship. The program also provides a number of support services to include respite care, educational/informational forums on various topics specific to persons with disabilities, a support group, and volunteer network to families. ## SERVICES

### *FAMILY ADVOCACY PROGRAM*

The Family Advocacy Program provides prevention, crisis intervention, and treatment services directed toward family violence and child abuse. The FAP focuses on interventions that prevent family violence and child abuse by addressing the risk factors, underlying causes, and effects of family violence on both adult and child victims. When abuse does occur, Family Advocacy concentrates on the safety of the victims, rehabilitative services for the offenders, and consultation with the commands. Services provided on an ongoing basis include stress and anger management, relationship and communication workshops, conflict management, 24-hour victim advocacy, individual counseling, domestic violence support groups and support groups for victims of abuse.

FAP also offers marriage and family counseling services for individuals and couples, providing short-term counseling and other forms of intervention for coping with life's daily stressors. In addition to counseling, we also offer information and referrals to other military and civilian resources and services. All services are kept confidential. The Family Advocacy office is located on the main level of Little Hall, Building 2034, Barnett Avenue. For more information call 703-784-2570.

### *FAMILY READINESS PROGRAM*

Family readiness is a combat multiplier; equally as important as individual, equipment, and combat readiness. It is the ability of the individual Marine and their family to successfully balance life, career, and mission events through active and reserve service and is supported by the enduring partnership between the unit's Family Readiness Command Team and Marine Corps Community Services. It is an obligation between the Corps, the Marine and their entire family. The individual Marine is responsible and accountable for his personal and family readiness. The Unit Family Readiness Program is the responsibility of the commanding officer. MCCS is responsible to support the individual Marine, their family, and the Unit Family Readiness Program. ### *INFORMATION AND REFERRAL*

The Information and Referral program links active duty, retired personnel and their families to a variety of services and programs provided by both military and civilian resources. ### *LEGAL ASSISTANCE*

Licensed attorneys certified by the Judge Advocate General of the Navy provide free legal assistance services to active duty members and their dependents, retirees, and reservists activated for thirty days or more. Services include: estate planning (wills, advance medical directives, powers of attorney); family law (separation, divorce, adoptions); consumer law (fair debt collection, credit reporting, landlord-tenant); immigration and naturalization; notary services; and seasonal income tax preparation. The Legal Assistance Office and VITA Tax Center is located in Building 3095, Roan Street; the entrance for the Tax Center (which is open only from mid-January until April 15th) is at the rear of the building. ### MEDICAL CARE

#### Dental Clinic

The main dental clinic is located on the second floor in the south end of the Naval Health Clinic. Other clinics on base are located at The Basic School in the Ray Hall Medical/Dental Clinic and the Marine Corps Air Facility, Building 2100. Military personnel are provided complete dental services, although some specialty care may require referrals to other military or civilian clinics. Routine examinations, annual Deployment Health Screenings, Active Duty sick call services and records check-in/check-out are available daily from 7:30 to 11 a.m. and 12:30 to 2 p.m. Due to current military dental readiness and health requirements, family members and retirees are not routinely seen. Family members and retirees are encouraged to use their respective

TRICARE Dental Plans for their dental health needs. Individuals with emergency dental problems requiring immediate attention on weekends, holidays or after 3:30 p.m. on normal workdays may receive treatment at Potomac or Mary Washington Hospital's emergency rooms.

#### Naval Health Clinic

The primary source of medical care for Marine Corps Base is the Naval Health Clinic (NHCL), Quantico, located at 3259 Catlin Ave., near Lejeune Hall, the Marine Corps Base headquarters. The clinic does not have emergency medical services available. Life threatening injuries and illnesses that require immediate treatment should be evaluated at the nearest emergency room, and can be accessed by dialing 911. If you are enrolled in TRICARE Prime you must call 877-TRICARE (874-2273) for authorization for acute out-of-the-area medical care.

The mission of the clinic is to provide and coordinate health care and wellness services for active duty members to maximize readiness. The clinic provides services to all eligible beneficiaries who have enrolled in TRICARE Prime at NHCL Quantico.

Normal operating hours for the clinic are 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday with the exception of Thursday. Command training is conducted Thursdays from 1 to 4 p.m. The clinic has limited after-hours services Monday through Friday 4 to 6 p.m., Saturday and Sunday closed. The clinic has the following medical specialists: family practice, primary care, pediatrics, sports medicine, flight surgeon, internal medicine, mental health, optometry, occupational/preventive medicine, radiology, social services and physical therapy.

Visiting physicians from the National Naval Medical Center, Bethesda, and other military treatment facilities provide specialty care on a limited basis in cardiology, pediatric urology, endocrinology, ENT, hematology and oncology, neurology, OB/GYN, occupational therapy, ophthalmology, dermatology, orthopedics, podiatry, prenatal care, pulmonary, and rheumatology. All appointments for specialists are by referral only. The clinic has a toll-free phone line at 888-784-1802.

### NAVY-MARINE CORPS RELIEF SOCIETY

The Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society is a private, non-profit emergency relief organization supported solely by donations from Navy

and Marine Corps personnel. Its purpose is to provide temporary assistance to active-duty and retired Marines and sailors and their eligible family members in the form of interest-free loans and grants. Assistance can include funds for basic living expenses, car repairs, emergency travel, pay problems, medical and dental co-pay, funeral expenses, and other needs. The society also offers financial counseling and can suggest ways to reduce debt. Other services include budget for baby classes, layettes for newborns, visiting nurse services, and education loans and scholarships. The society relies on dedicated, trained volunteers from the community. Volunteers gain job skills and work in a friendly, rewarding environment. Volunteer mileage and childcare are paid. ### *NEW PARENT SUPPORT PROGRAM*

Shortly after the completion and dedication of the chapel, a voluntary fund drive was begun to install glass windows appropriate to the memorial nature of the chapel. Eighteen strikingly etched glass windows combine religious motifs with Marine Corps history scenes from 1775 to recent times. Another item of historical interest is the communion rail which was fashioned out of remnants of deck planking from eight battleships and cruisers that supported Marine Corps amphibious operations in World War II.

### *RELOCATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM*

The Relocation Assistance Program provides base newcomers and personnel departing for new duty stations with base "Welcome Aboard" briefs, relocation workshops, and extensive information thru the Military HOMEFRONT Web site for military duty stations worldwide. 

## ATHLETICS

The Quantico MCCA Athletic Program is located in Barber Physical Activities Center, Building 2073. The Athletic Program is designed to assist Marines in promoting morale and esprit de corps, while keeping physically fit and mentally alert, and to fulfill the leisure needs and interests of military personnel, their family members and eligible DOD civilians. The program provides recreational, informal, and competitive athletic activities. The sports program is composed of five elements: All-Marine and higher levels of competition, intramurals, varsity sports, recreational and informal walk-in activities. ### Varsity Sports

Varsity teams compete in the Washington Area Military Athletic Conference as well as local civilian and military tournaments and leagues. Varsity teams also compete in the Marine Corps East Coast Regionals which can lead to higher levels of competition for Marine athletes such as Armed Forces Championships, Olympics, national, and international events. The following Varsity Sports are offered at Quantico: basketball, softball, soccer, rugby, mountain biking, triathlon, golf, bowling, volleyball, cross country, and skeet shooting.

### All-Marine Sports

Quantico is frequently asked to host other All-Marine, Armed Forces and national events. The athletic office provides support and assistance to Quantico Marines into the All-Marine sports program.

### Intramurals

Intramurals provide opportunities for participation in a wide range of individual and dual sports for both men and women. The varsity sports teams participate in the Washington Area Military Athletic Conference and local military and civilian tournaments and leagues.

### Youth Sports

Youth Sports provides a co-ed and inclusive (special needs children) recreational and instructional sports program that includes the

sports of basketball, baseball, and soccer. Emphasis is placed on fair and equal play no matter the skill level, teaching teamwork, good sportsmanship, and improving skill level. All Youth Sport coaches are volunteers and must be certified under the National Youth Sports Coach Association. Training includes basic coaching, coaching children with disabilities (inclusion), and sport specific.

The Youth Sports director and assistance director are both certified clinicians under the National Alliance for Youth Sports and teach training classes for coaches. All coaches are also required to undergo background checks. More than 100 volunteers participate in the Youth Sports program. ### *SEMPER FIT BRANCH*

Headquartered in the General Raymond G. Davis Center at 3300 Russell Road, the Marine Corps Combat Development Command was created on Nov. 10, 1987, by the 28th commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. P.X. Kelly. The command is comprised of the Marine Corps Warfighting Laboratory, the Capabilities Development Directorate (formerly the Expeditionary Force Development Center), and Training and Education Command.

The MCCDC commanding general, as deputy commandant for Combat Development and Integration through the Capabilities Development Directorate, is the owner of the Expeditionary Force Development System. The EFDS process encompasses all activities and organizations required to produce, improve and sustain combat-ready Marine Air Ground Task Forces for deployment. Focusing on Service and Joint Operations, the EFDS process integrates combat development across all functional warfighting areas both internally to the Marine Corps, and externally in the Joint environment. ### *CAPABILITIES DEVELOPMENT DIRECTORATE*

The Capabilities Development Directorate, MCCDC's custodian of the Expeditionary Force Development System, is located in the General Raymond G. Davis Center. The CDD, responsible to the Deputy Commandant for Combat Development and Integration, is the integrating body that conducts combat development using the DOD capabilities-based planning process. In concert with Marine Corps advocates, proponents, MARFORs and the supporting establishment, the CDD ensures the fielding of all warfighting capabilities are integrated across the spectrum of doctrine, organization, training, materiel, leadership and education, personnel, and facilities.

The EFDS is a formal system of processes, decision points, and functions that produce integrated capabilities, based on evolving and future warfighting concepts and capabilities, that provide identified required capabilities to the operating forces and combatant commanders.

The CDD is comprised of seven Integration Divisions and the Total Force Structure Division.

### *MAGTF INTEGRATION DIVISION*

The MAGTF ID integrates across all functional warfighting integration divisions. The MID oversees several important capability development events such as the Front End Assessment. The MID also develops, monitors, and maintains the Expeditionary Capabilities List, the MAGTF Requirements List, and manages the Universal Needs Statement process. Integral to the MID is the imbedded joint, multinational and MAGTF doctrine section, and a JCIDS requirements documentation staff.

## *FIRES AND MANEUVER INTEGRATION DIVISION*

The Fires and Maneuver Integration Division's mission is to integrate future and evolving air and ground concepts with identified capabilities, requirements, and supporting programs to synchronize Marine Corps initiatives and shape naval and joint initiatives within the JCIDS process. The FMID responsibilities include operational capability development for aviation, tactical mobility and counter mobility, infantry, special operations, fire support, armor, unmanned systems, and information operations.

## *INTELLIGENCE INTEGRATION DIVISION*

The Intelligence Integration Division integrates Marine Corps Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Enterprise requirements over the near (2005-2011), mid (2012-2018), and far-term (2019+) horizons. The IID coordinates closely with CDD's functional integration divisions to ensure the responsiveness and effectiveness of MCISR-E support to the MAGTF Commander across the spectrum of joint and combined military operations.

In conjunction with the Marine Corps advocates, the MARFORs, and the joint community, IID continually shapes Marine Corps intelligence capabilities in the context of current challenges and emerging concepts, to include the Global War on Terrorism and the Marine Corps concepts of Expeditionary Maneuver Warfare, Distributed Operations, and Ship To Objective Maneuver. The division's broad focus spans the DOTMLPF considerations inherent in USMC capabilities that enable all phases of the intelligence cycle.

## *LOGISTICS INTEGRATION DIVISION*

The LID's mission is to integrate future and evolving logistics concepts with identified capabilities, requirements, doctrinal publications, and supporting programs to synchronize Marine Corps initiatives and shape naval and joint initiatives within the JCIDS process. This very broad combat support and combat service support functional area includes the following responsible areas: Transportation, supply, engineering, ammunition, medical/health systems support, and all echelons of ground and aviation maintenance. The LID's items of

interest include the future high mobility multi-purpose wheeled vehicle, logistics transfer vehicle armoring, logistics vehicle system replacement, autonomic logistics, and health service support reorganization.

## *COMMAND AND CONTROL INTEGRATION DIVISION*

The C2ID's mission is to lead the Marine Corps command and control capabilities development process by integrating evolving and future C2 concepts with identified requirements and supporting programs, in order to synchronize Marine Corps, naval, and joint C2 initiatives.

Divided into a MAGTF C2 Branch, External Integration Branch, and a Capabilities Branch, C2 ID is responsible for or active in the following area / warfighting functions: MAGTF C2, MAGTF C2 CONOPs IPR, Joint Blue Force Situational Awareness, Joint Battle Management C2, Joint Tactical COP Workstation, Marine Corps Common Hardware Suite, JCIDS Capabilities Toolkit, C2 JIC, FORCENET, Combat Identification, among others.

## *FORCE PROTECTION INTEGRATION DIVISION*

The FPID's mission is to integrate future and evolving force protection concepts, with identified capabilities, requirements, and supporting programs to synchronize Marine Corps initiatives and shape naval and joint initiatives within the JCIDS process. The FPID's focus is on combat force protection issues dealing with explosive hazards, Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear defense, missile defense, and non-lethal weapons.

## *TOTAL FORCES STRUCTURE DIVISION*

The Total Force Structure Division's mission is to provide and maintain optimal force structure for the Marine Corps through the integration of the active, reserve, and civilian manpower structure in concert with the equipment required to perform the Marine Corps mission. The TFSD actively interacts with all advocates, proponents, Marine forces, and the supporting establishment to shape and define force structure requirements. TFSD oversees two major USMC initiatives: the Force Structure Review Group and the Marine Corps Equipment Review Group.

## *OPERATIONS ANALYSIS DIVISION*

The Operations Analysis Division is the Marine Corps focal point for operations research, analytic support and studies management. It provides critical support to the operating forces and the Expeditionary Force Development System by blending a comprehensive understanding of military operations with advanced analytic and decision-making tools, to include a wide range of computer-based models and combat simulations.

These tools are employed to assist the commanding general at MCCDC with his mission of creating and maintaining combat-ready MAGTFs. The Operations Analysis Division's primary mission is to assist the Marine Corps in making decisions about weapon systems, equipment acquisition and resource allocation. A continuous program of mission area analyses, formal studies, rapid response analytic efforts and the supervision of research projects fulfill this mission. The division provides



combat analyst assessment teams for national emergencies and contingencies.

The division is responsible for initiating, conducting or supervising all official Marine Corps studies, maintaining official Marine Corps scenarios, and participating in and reviewing the efforts of external activities such as the Office of the Secretary of Defense and the Joint Staff. The division is organized into four branches to support its multi-faceted mission: Analysis Branch, Mission Area Analysis Branch, Joint and External Analysis Branch, and Marine Corps Studies System Management Branch.

### SEABASING INTEGRATION DIVISION

The Seabasing Integration Division develops and promulgates the Marine Corps ship-based (Amphibious, Pre-positioning, and Craft) warfighting capabilities and requirements within the Naval Capabilities Development Process. Further, SBID determines and informs associated required capabilities in the areas of doctrine, organization, training and education, equipment, and support facilities to ensure the Marine Corps is fully supported by the Navy ship building plan so that combat ready forces are capable of full participation in and support of expeditionary missions. SBID's focus areas include: MPF (Future), Joint High Speed Vessel, strategic lift, LHA (Replacement), future ship requirements, amphibious lift requirements, and Seabasing experimentation requirements.

### WARFIGHTING LABORATORY

The Marine Corps Warfighting Laboratory (MCWL) is at the center of current and future warfighting capabilities for the Marine Corps. MCWL is focused on the individual Marine rifleman and their efforts reflect both service-specific needs as well as Marine Corps contributions to the future Joint warfighting environment.

As part of the Marine Corps Combat Development Command, MCWL's purpose is to improve current and future naval expeditionary warfare capabilities across the spectrum of conflict for the operating forces. MCWL does this through service and joint experimentation; evaluation of new tactics, techniques, procedures and technologies; and forwards results of experimentation to Marine Corps Systems Command with recommendations.





## *MISSION STATEMENT*

The mission of the Training and Education Command, located in Building 1019, is to develop, coordinate, resource, execute and evaluate training and education concepts, policies, plans and programs to ensure Marines are prepared to meet the challenges of present and future operational environments.

TECOM was established within the MCCDC on July 1, 2000. The commanding general of TECOM assists the commanding general of MCCDC in fulfilling the commandant's Title 10 responsibilities regarding the training and education of Marines. The elements of the command located aboard Quantico consist of Training Command, Education Command (Marine Corps University), MAGTF Staff Training Program Center, College of Continuing Education, Security Cooperation Education and Training Center, and the Marine Corps Center for Lessons Learned.

## *COMMAND AND CONTROL TRAINING AND EDUCATION CENTER OF EXCELLENCE*

The C2 TECOE serves as the central Marine Corps agency for C2 training and education issues within the DOTMLPF process in order to synchronize the art and science of MAGTF C2 training and education requirements from the individual Marine through all levels of MAGTF commanders and their staffs. The C2 TECOE is chartered to perform the following core functions: Develop, coordinate, and implement a C2 strategic training and education plan for the C2 warfighting functions, in concert with the Operating Forces and Supporting Establishment.

Develop and review training and readiness manuals that impact C2 skills; review all C2 training and education for Marines at the various training venues and formal schools located throughout the Marine Corps to ensure there is standardization of all programs of instruction in support of C2 training and education.

Serve as the TECOM, C2 training and education representative to the C2 Integration Division, MCCDC, to the Marine Corps Warfighting Lab, and to the various C2 systems Project Offices located at Marine Corps Systems Command.

Additionally, C2 TECOE serves as the TECOM C2 representative on any HQMC sponsored, Operational Advisory Group dealing with C2 issues. The C2 TECOE works closely with the TECOM staff and tenant organizations, the C2 advocates at HQMC (PPO, C4, AV, I&L), Navy Marine Corps Intelligence Center, and selected Joint, service and coalition agencies to provide integrated and timely C2 systems training solutions for the Marine Corps. The C2 TECOE has operational and administrative control of all MAGTF Integrated Systems Training Centers. The MISTCs provide timely and relevant training in both the art and science of C2 to commanders, staffs, and individual Marines located throughout the Operating Forces. There are four MISTCs: MISTC East, Camp Lejeune, MISTC West, Camp Pendleton, MISTC Okinawa, and MISTC 29 Palms.

### *MARINE AIR-GROUND TASK FORCE STAFF TRAINING PROGRAM*

The Marine Air-Ground Task Force Staff Training Program Center is located in Buildings 2042 and 2084. The mission of MSTP is to provide training in MAGTF warfighting skills, within the context of a joint and combined environment, in order to improve the warfighting skills of senior commanders and their staffs and to provide feedback into the Expeditionary Force Development System. The program focuses its efforts at the Marine Expeditionary Force and Marine Expeditionary Brigade levels. The MSTP staff provides training to the MEFs and MEBs in support of the training objectives established by the senior commanders of those organizations. The training is doctrinally based and is designed to enhance the capability of the Operating Forces to meet current and near-term operational requirements.

MSTP also assists in the development of Marine Corps doctrine, provides instruction to the Marine Corps University, and conducts the General Officer Warfighting Program. MSTP operates the Battle Staff Training Facility, which develops processes and procedures to enable the Operating Forces to use current C4I and Modeling & Simulation technology in an integrated manner to support MAGTF planning, operations and training.

MSTP is composed of a Headquarters Branch, Operations Branch, MAGTF Branch, Exercise Design Branch, Command and Control Support Branch, Modeling and Simulation Branch, Command and Control Training and Education Center of Excellence and MSTP Reserve Detachment. Additionally, MSTP utilizes Senior Mentors, (retired Marine Corps general officers personally selected by the commandant) to provide experienced-based counsel, advice and recommendations to the senior commanders, their staffs, and the MSTP staff.

### *SECURITY COOPERATION EDUCATION & TRAINING CENTER*

Assigned to TECOM, the Security Cooperation Education and Training Center is a Marine Corps asset. The mission of the cen-

ter is to manage and coordinate Marine Corps education and training programs in support of Department of Defense security cooperation and security assistance efforts to enhance interoperability with allied and coalition partners in the conduct of traditional and irregular warfare and in support of the global struggle against violent extremism.

This includes coordinating and tracking CONUS-based Marine Corps education and training programs for international students; preparing and deploying security cooperation teams and advisors to execute OCONUS mis-



sions not executed by operational forces; and providing a link to governmental and non-governmental organizations in support of USMC efforts in humanitarian operations. Normally located in Building 3094, the center is temporarily located in buildings 3035 and 3028 while Building 3094 is renovated.

### *MARINES CORPS CENTER FOR LESSONS LEARNED*

The Marine Corps Center for Lessons Learned is located in Building 1776. The mission of the MCCLL is to support the CMC in his Title 10 responsibilities. The MCCLL collects, analyzes, manages, and disseminates knowledge gained from exercises and operations. The MCCLL manages the Marine Corps Lessons Management System, a centralized searchable database of lessons, observations, tactics, techniques, and procedures.

### *CENTER FOR ADVANCED OPERATIONAL CULTURE LEARNING*

Established in May 2005, the Center for Advanced Operational Culture Learning is the

Marine Corps' culture and operational language Center of Excellence. CAOCL ensures Marines are equipped with operationally relevant regional, culture and language knowledge, to allow them to plan and operate successfully in the joint and combined expeditionary environment:

- In any region of the world
- In current and potential operating environments
- Targeting emerging irregular and traditional threats

CAOCL's mission is to promote an understanding of cultural issues and ensure warfighters grasp culture as a component of operational planning. CAOCL provides Marines with the knowledge to leverage cultural factors in order to gain a tactical advantage. The center serves as the Corps' "one-stop" to coordinate targeted culture/language training for deploying forces.

### TRAINING COMMAND



Training Command, headquarters located in Butler Hall Building 1019, has the mission to coordinate, resource, execute and evaluate training concepts, policies, plans and programs to ensure Marines are trained to a common standard in order to meet the challenges of present and future operational environments. To that end, Training Command is responsible for the 12 formal Marine Corps schools and 42 Marine detachments at other service locations.

Training Command is tasked to analyze, develop, publish, review, and revise individual training standards, mission performance standards, core competencies, training and readiness manuals; to review and approve formal courses of instruction to obtain, coordinate, adjudicate and publish the Marine Corps' formal school training requirements; to provide technical guidance, instruction, and assistance for planning and designing formal courses of instruction; and to provide a single point of contact linkage to other services on all issues pertaining to interservice formal school house training. A number of the formal schools are designated as the centers of Excellence for a

particular mission area; examples at Quantico are the Martial Arts Center of excellence at The Basic School and Weapons Training Battalion for marksmanship.

#### Officer Candidates School

Officer Candidates School, a formal school within Training Command, located on Brown Field, has been at Quantico since 1935. The school annually trains, evaluates and screens more than 2,500 officer candidates to ensure that they possess the moral, intellectual and physical qualities for commissioning and the leadership potential to serve successfully as company-grade officers in the operating forces. The Officer Candidates Class, Platoon Leaders Class (junior, senior and combined), and the Bulldog Program (Naval ROTC) are conducted at OCS.

#### The Basic School

The Basic School, a formal school within Training Command, is located at Camp Barrett. Each year the school educates more than 1,700 newly commissioned or appointed officers in the high standards of professional knowledge, esprit de corps and leadership required to prepare them for duty as company grade officers in the Fleet Marine Force operating forces with particular emphasis on the duties, responsibilities and warfighting skills required of a rifle platoon commander.

TBS also conducts the Infantry Officer Course to provide additional infantry skill training for officers in preparation for duty as platoon commanders of rifle, weapons, anti-armor, heavy machine guns and mortar platoons within the infantry battalion and as platoon commanders within the light armored reconnaissance battalion. Additionally, TBS is the home of the Marine Corps Martial Arts Center of Excellence.

#### Weapons Training Battalion

Weapons Training Battalion, part of Training Command and the Marine Corps Center of Excellence for Marksmanship, schedules, coordinates and executes rifle and pistol qualifications for newly commissioned Marine officers, as well as re-qualification for all Quantico Marines. The battalion, located in Building 27211, provides facilities and training for reserve units, Marine Corps Security Guard Battalion and numerous other organizations. Training and range support is also provided to federal agencies such as the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Drug Enforcement Agency and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco

and Firearms, as well as numerous state and local law enforcement agencies.

Weapons Training Battalion is the parent organization of the United States Marine Corps Shooting Teams, encompassing the rifle, pistol, and international teams. Additionally, the battalion is the home of the Marine Corps Scout Sniper Instructor courses; Dynamic Entry School courses; High Risk Personnel Course; Small Arms Weapons Instructor course, Marksmanship Instructor Courses (Regular and Reserve) and a six-week Range Officers Course. The battalion has the only authorized weapons manufacturing and testing facility, with an organic ammunition loading capability, in the Marine Corps. The battalion builds and maintains the M40A1 and M40A3 sniper rifles, various Marine Expeditionary Unit (special operations capable) weapons and all the competition rifles and pistols in the Marine Corps and Marine Corps Reserve. The ammunition loading facility hand loads high power ammunition for the rifle team, for special operations, and for testing new weapons and bullets. The battalion's Marksmanship Programs Management Section functions as the single point of contact on marksmanship matters for the Marine Corps. ### Communications School

Communications School is a Formal Learning Center within Training Command, located at Edson Hall. Established at Quantico, June 1, 1944, Communications School graduates students who are well prepared to confront complex tactical and operational-level, communications challenges across all elements of the MAGTF. Communications School conducts three courses:

- Basic Communications Officer Course
- Advanced Communications Officer Course
- Warrant Officer Communications Courses

The Basic Communications Officer Courses is a 19-week program of instruction that provides professional training in the planning and employment of tactical communications systems in order to prepare company grade officers for entry-level billets in the Operating Forces. Core curriculum areas include communications theory, single channel radio, tactical telephone switching systems, tactical data networks, tactical multi-channel radio systems, and communications planning. Upon Graduation students are awarded the MOS 0602, Communications Officer.

The Advanced Communication Officers Courses is a ten-week program that provides



professional, formal skill progression-training in technical planning to Captains and Majors. The curriculum includes the development of Major Subordinate Command Annex K and student confirmation briefs based on an Operational Scenario. Upon graduation students are awarded the NMOS 0603, Advanced Communications Officer.

The Warrant Officer Communications Courses for MOS 0610, 0620, and 0650 are each eight-week courses that are conducted simultaneously and provide professional, technical training in the areas of transmissions, switching systems and data networks, as well as communications planning in order to prepare them for billets as Subject Matter experts in the Operative Forces.

### EDUCATION COMMAND/ MARINE CORPS UNIVERSITY

Marine Corps University develops leaders of strong moral character, intellectual agility, and physical endurance, in order to serve our nation in war and peace. The main campus is located on the banks of the Potomac River just south of the Town of Quantico. University Headquarters is in Breckinridge Hall, located in Building 2076. The university is comprised of the Marine Corps War College, Command and Staff College, School of Advanced

Warfighting, Expeditionary Warfare School, Staff Noncommissioned Officer Academies throughout the world, and the College of Continuing Education. MCU also runs the History and Museums Division and the General Alfred M. Gray Marine Corps Research Center, bringing to fruition the Marine Corps' vision of providing a world-class institution that educates Marines in the art of war and produces leaders with the confidence and vision to exercise sound military judgment in battle.

MCU hosts the Commanders Course and Senior Leader Development Program. The Commanders Course is a semi-annual resident program of instruction for colonels and lieutenant colonels selected for command. It provides information concerning up-to-date policies and programs that will guide them in the execution of their future duties. The Senior Leader Development Program provides formalized, executive-level education to Marine Corps general officers and members of the Senior Executive Service.

The university is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to confer master's degrees. Web site: [www.mcu.usmc.mil](http://www.mcu.usmc.mil).

### Marine Corps War College

The mission of the Marine Corps War

College is to educate selected senior officers and civilians for decision-making during war and military operations other than war in a joint, interagency, and multinational environment. The MCWAR graduates are prepared to assume senior leadership positions of increasing complexity through the study of national military strategy, theater strategy and plans, and military support to those strategies within the context of national security policies, decision-making, objectives and resources. Unique aspects of the curriculum include active learning seminars with prominent guests, frequent trips to national agencies in the Washington, D.C., area, and national and international travel to visit unified commanders and their staffs to learn more about their areas of responsibility. The MCWAR offers a masters degree in Strategic Studies.

### Command and Staff College

The Command and Staff College, located in Breckinridge Hall, provides field grade officers of the Marine Corps and other U.S. services, as well as officers from designated foreign countries, the intermediate level professional military education required to function in command and staff assignments with

members of the academic community. The instruction is presented in the setting of field-grade workshops requiring individual and group problem solving enhanced by extensive student exercises, computer-assisted battle simulations and historical battle studies. Command and Staff College offers a masters degree in Military Studies.

### School of Advanced Warfighting

Also in Breckinridge Hall, the School of Advanced Warfighting provides a graduate-level professional military education for select field grade officers of the Marine Corps, other U.S. services, and selected foreign countries. The goal of SAW is to enhance officers' operational-level decision making skills so they can contribute more effectively to the nation's armed forces in meeting the demands of the future. The curriculum is designed as a progressive study of the framework for military institutions and how nations prepare for war. The course analyzes recent and contemporary military history, focusing on problems that military leaders faced and the subsequent influence their solution had on military institutions. The instruction is presented in the setting of a graduate seminar where the emphasis

provides career-level professional military education with emphasis on combined arms operations, warfighting skills, tactical decision-making, and MAGTFs in amphibious operations. The school prepares Marine captains to function as commanders and staff officers at appropriate levels within the operating forces. In addition, EWS provides career-level professional military education to selected officers from the Marine Corps Reserve.

Essential to this education is the development of the students' communication skills and leadership abilities. Occupational Field Expansion Courses in ground combat, aviation and combat service support supplement the core curriculum to more fully prepare graduates for anticipated billets in the operating forces.

### Staff Noncommissioned Officer Academy

The Staff Noncommissioned Officer Academy, headquartered at the main campus, was established in February 1971. The academy offers noncommissioned and staff noncommissioned officers the requisite professional military education leadership training that enhances their professional quali-



joint, combined, service and other high-level military organizations. Emphasis is on duties with MAGTFs at the Marine expeditionary force level operating in a joint and/or combined environment. A guest-lecture program includes high-level government officials and

is on active learning and problem solving.

### Expeditionary Warfare School

The Expeditionary Warfare School was established at Quantico in 1921 and resides in Geiger Hall. The present nine-month school

provides preparation for assuming duties of greater responsibility.

The Quantico-based academy is specifically dedicated to the validation of all enlisted PME for all academies located at Camp Pendleton, Calif.; Camp Lejeune, N.C.;



Twenty-nine Palms, Calif.; Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii; and Camp Butler, Okinawa, Japan.

### **College of Continuing Education**

Established May 1, 1997, the College of Continuing Education is the university's PME school responsible for advancing the Distance Education Programs of the university's Expeditionary Warfare School and Command and Staff College resident schools. Located on the main campus in Building 3092, the CCE supports career PME for Marines, serves as a center for scholarship and distance learning expertise, and ensures that Marines have opportunities to pursue PME through Distance Education Programs (formerly designated as the nonresident programs).

The centerpiece of the CCE concept is the establishment of seven satellite campuses aboard major bases and stations, including Marine Forces Reserve. Regional coordinators manage all satellite campus activities and

work closely with local commanders to improve PME opportunities for all Marines. Satellite campuses are located at Quantico, Camp Lejeune, N.C., Cherry Point, N.C., Camp Pendleton, Calif., Miramar, Calif., Hawaii, and Okinawa, Japan. Marines can register for programs, obtain information, and connect with other students in their area by contacting their Regional Coordinator.

### **General Alfred M. Gray Marine Corps Research Center**

The Gray Research Center is a 100,500 square-foot facility specifically designed to meet the growing information needs of a global force in readiness as the Corps enters the 21st century.

The mission of the GRC is to support the Marine Corps by providing a comprehensive facility for the study of expeditionary and amphibious warfighting. The GRC focuses on linking scholarly research and schools of pro-

fessional military education with lessons learned from the field in order to stimulate the development of successful concepts, doctrine, tactics, techniques and procedures. A comprehensive collection of traditional library, research and archival material is readily available to anyone visiting the facility. The GRC ultimately will contain over 500,000 items, including maps, books, reports, annuals and historically significant planning documents. The GRC itself consists of five functional areas: the James Carson Breckinridge Professional Library, the research library/patron work area, the MCCS Family Library, the Marine Corps University Archives, and the Marine Corps Lessons Learned Library. In addition, patrons visiting the GRC are able to access a variety of electronic bulletin boards, on-line electronic databases and CD-ROM titles. Because the GRC's bibliographic and on-line databases are linked to the worldwide Marine Corps data network,

# MARINE CORPS NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION COMMAND



Marine Corps National Capital Region Command was established to facilitate consolidation of base support functions, to provide anti-terrorism and force protection coordination for the Marine Corps in the NCR and to coordinate emergency response with DOD, federal, state, and local authorities in the region. MCNCR is commanded by the Commanding General of the Marine Corps Combat Development Command. He has delegated day-to-day responsibility for mission assurance and contingency planning to the deputy MCNCR, who is also dual-hatted as the Commander, Marine Corps Base Quantico.

As a Supporting Establishment Command in support of Marine Forces NORTHCOM (MARFORNORTH), CG MCNCR, coordinates a regional Mission Assurance program for the protection of USMC personnel, assets and infrastructure located in the National Capital Region. The MCNCR Mission Assurance program includes Antiterrorism, Critical Infrastructure Protection, CBRNE Protection, Threat Analysis, Physical Security, Emergency Management and Contingency Plans.

As the USMC service component to JFHQ-NCR, CG MCNCR (as COMMARFORNCR), will receive forces apportioned for NCR land homeland defense and defense support to civil authorities, support joint planning efforts, establish liaison with USMC commanders in the NCR joint operating area, and coordinate joint planning process activities with the Commandant of the Marine Corps planners; Commander, Marine Forces Command; and Commander, Marine Forces North. The command also conducts joint training and exercises associated with JFHQ-NCR in support of land homeland defense and defense support of civil authorities. Upon receipt of a Secretary of Defense Execute Order, CG MCNCR will receive Marine Corps forces to conduct land homeland defense and defense support of civil authorities in the NCR Joint Operating Area.

CG MCNCR coordinates USMC support to numerous national level special events, and National Special Security Events to include the quadrennial Presidential Inauguration, the annual State Of The Union Address, and Presidential State Funerals. Additionally, in the event of a terrorist attack or significant natural disaster in the NCR, MCNCR Marines could find themselves directly involved in assisting first responders, assisting in coordinating regional emergency responses, and providing critical infrastructure protection, as well as providing installations as staging points in support of disaster operations.



# MARINE CORPS BASE QUANTICO

Marine Corps Base Quantico is home to the Marine Corps Combat Development Command and numerous tenant organizations. The base staff provides infrastructure, operational, and community services support to these organizations and to the military members, families, and civilians who live and work on base. The base is also a key player in support of overall Marine Corps objectives and programs, and plays host to scores of training events, conferences, symposia, and other special events. ## *HEADQUARTERS AND SERVICE BATTALION*

On Oct. 1, 1980, Headquarters Battalion and Support Battalion were combined to form Headquarters and Service Battalion. It is currently the parent command for nearly 60 percent of the personnel assigned aboard Quantico, and is the largest battalion in the Marine Corps. The battalion commander is located in Building 2006.

The administrative, legal and disbursing support of nearly 4,000 Marines is managed at battalion level by real-time links to Headquarters Marine Corps and the Defense Finance and Accounting Service in Kansas City, Mo. The billeting and subsistence functions, as well as scheduling, administering and documenting military training, Marine battle skills training, and professional military education, are performed by the officers and enlisted Marines and civilians in the battalion headquarters and company offices. Additionally, HQSVC Bn. staff provide general and personnel administrative support and focused logistics support for a multitude of events throughout the National Capital Region.

The five organic companies of the battalion are Headquarters Company, Operations Company, Service Company, Training and Education Company, and Tenant Activities Company. Installation Personnel Administrative Center, a division of Base G-1, is located in the Headquarters and Service Battalion building. ## *SECURITY BATTALION*

Security Battalion, Building 2043, is comprised of the provost marshal's office, brig and fire department. The provost marshal is responsible for law enforcement aboard Quantico. Security Battalion provides the personnel to staff the law enforcement needs and the brig aboard Quantico, as well as personnel who provide administrative, logistical and training support for the battalion. Military police and criminal investigations sections of the battalion provide a full range of police support including: preventing and suppressing crime; investigating criminal offenses and traf-

fic accidents; apprehending offenders; registering privately owned vehicles, pets and weapons; and traffic control. The battalion also conducts physical security surveys and operates the brig. Base MPs work closely with Town of Quantico law enforcement officers and with both county and state police. The base fire department provides firefighting, first responder emergency medical and hazardous materials spill response, tactical rescue, and fire prevention. Fire safety education services are also provided by the fire department for the base and tenant activities. ### COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Marine Corps Base Quantico is comprised of more than 6,700 military personnel, 6,900 civilians, and 2,500 family members. This large and diverse population has a tremendous impact on the surrounding towns and counties, which requires a comprehensive community relations program.

The purpose of community relations is to develop mutually beneficial relationships between the base and local communities. Our primary tool used for accomplishing this mission is the Civilian-Military Council. The

council, composed of civic leaders from the surrounding towns and counties as well as base officials, meets quarterly to address pertinent issues.

A large part of our community relations program involves educating the public about the Marine Corps and the base. This mission is usually accomplished in two ways. Marines participate in the community through several outreach programs, and occasionally, the public is invited to various events on the base.

Each year Marines take the Corps to the community. The Quantico Adopt-A-School program provides sustained outreach to schools in the surrounding communities through mentoring and participation in special events. Marines, sailors and civilians also donate their time to participate in local "career days." The speakers' bureau is another tool at the commanding general's disposal to expand the communities' understanding of the Corps.

### QUANTICO MARINE BAND

The Quantico Marine Band has achieved and maintains an enviable record of professionalism, delighting thousands of listeners in hundreds of performances throughout the northeastern United States and Canada. The

Quantico Marine Band performs in a variety of ceremonial and concert appearances on military installations and in public. The Quantico Marine Band maintains the capability to perform as a marching band, concert band, stage band, or small musical ensembles.

Past appearances of the band include activities for the presidential inauguration, the Aquafest in Minneapolis, Minn., and the First Marine Division Association reunion in Boston.

### MARINE CORPS MARATHON

Quantico is home to the Marine Corps Marathon Office, which has the responsibility of organizing one of the Corps' premier events.

The Marine Corps Marathon, often referred to as "The People's Marathon," begins and ends near the Marine Corps War Memorial in Arlington the fourth Sunday in October. The 26.2-mile road race attracts more than 30,000 participants as well as 100,000 spectators. ### *MANPOWER AND RESERVE AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT*

The Manpower and Reserve Affairs department is the largest department in Headquarters Marine Corps. Located in the James Wesley Marsh Center, Building 3280, M&RA is responsible for taking care of Marines and their families. Within the M&RA are the Manpower Management Information Systems Division, the Manpower Management Division, the Manpower Plans and Policy Division, the Personal and Family Readiness Division, and the Reserve Affairs Division. Certain elements of M&RA are located in Building 17 (Promotions Branch, MM Division), Building 2008 (Personnel Management Support Branch, MM Division), and Building 3044 (Business Operations Branch, MR Division). ### *MARINE CORPS RECRUITING COMMAND*

The Marine Corps Recruiting Command headquarters is located in the Marsh Center (Bldg.. 3280). MCRC conducts operations to recruit qualified individuals for enlistment or commissioning into the United States Marine Corps and Marine Corps Reserve in order to attain its assigned Total Force personnel requirements by component and category, in accordance with the applicable fiscal year Marine Corps Accession Strategy, the Military Personnel Procurement Manual, and as directed by the commandant of the Marine Corps.

### *MARINE CORPS SYSTEMS COMMAND*

The mission of Marine Corps Systems Command is to serve as the commandant's principal agent for equipping the operating forces to accomplish their warfighting mission. Systems Command is the recognized leader in equipping the Marine warfighter to win, by providing quality systems and equipment to the operating forces. The command manages systems and equipment during their entire life cycle and employs highly effective, streamlined and innovative business processes.

As MCCDC provides a validated mission need and operational requirement, MARCORSYSCOM acquires the required weapon systems. Program managers, reporting ultimately to the assistant secretary of the Navy for Research, Development and Acquisition, serve as the focal point for acquiring weapons systems. In order to ensure weapons systems provide maximum capability at minimum cost and are fielded in the minimum amount of time, PM's place significant emphasis on acquiring non-developmental items and entering joint development efforts with other services. ## MARINE CORPS OPERATIONAL TEST AND EVALUATION ACTIVITY

MCOTEA provides operational testing and evaluation for the Marine Corps and conducts additional testing and evaluation as required to support the Marine Corps' mission to man, train, equip, and sustain a force in readiness. The fundamental purpose of operational test and evaluation is to assist in managing the risks involved in developing, producing, fielding, operating, and sustaining systems and capabilities. System evaluations are typically overarching strategies, encompassing multiple developmental and operational test events and designed to reach a determination of a system's operational effectiveness, suitability, and survivability. Developmental and operational testing provides knowledge of system capabilities and limitations to the acquisition community, providing a basis for improving system performance. Furthermore, knowledge gained from operational testing can be used by the user community for optimizing system use during operations in the field. Operational Test and Evaluation allows the acquisition community to learn about operational limitations of the system while the system is still under development, enabling correction or mitigation of these limitations prior to full-rate production and deployment. This helps ensure fielded systems enhance warfighter effectiveness in operational environments.

MCOTEA is the independent Operational Test Agency for the United States Marine Corps and is the Marine Corps Executive Agent for operational testing. In this capacity, MCOTEA provides information to the Milestone Decision Authority as part of the decision-making process for the acquisition of solutions that satisfy validated user needs. MCOTEA serves the MDA, USMC, and the Department of Defense by objectively evaluating, under operational conditions, how well a solution meets required capabilities, as described by the approved system capability, threat, concept of operations, and concept of employment documents. MCOTEA's role is to ensure that systems being deployed to the field accomplish their assigned missions effectively without imposing unreasonable requirements on the field support infrastructure.

MCOTEA plans, tests, evaluates, and reports on all Assessments, Early Operational Assessments, Operational Assessments, Initial Operational Test and Evaluations, Follow-on Operational Test and Evaluations, multiservice

Operational Test and Evaluations, and Quick Reaction Assessments it has agreed to execute. In addition, MCOTEA observes and collaboratively plans the use of developmental test events to support a system's overall evaluation.

MCOTEA conducts tests only when a system is certified safe and ready thereby assuring the safety of the Marines on the test team and ensuring the equipment is truly ready to be subjected to the rigors of an operational test.

Tests are conducted in specially-designed operational scenarios as close to actual combat situations as possible and are based upon the requirements and mission profile of the gear. Tests can be conducted in several different environments including temperate, desert, jungle and arctic terrain.

It is the operational forces that initially identify a need for a piece of gear. Therefore it is Marines from the operational forces that assist in completing the cycle and ensuring their need is met by supporting the test and providing qualitative opinions regarding the combat effectiveness of the piece of gear developed to answer the need. Marines for the test are selected according to MOS and experience in that respective field or with similar equipment.

All tests strive to keep in mind the intended recipient of the gear: the individual warriors of the Marine forces. Simply put, MCOTEA is responsible for ensuring all new equipment introduced into the Marine Corps team works properly, helping the Corps continue to be the elite fighting force it has always been. Each piece of equipment, from the boots on Marine's feet and the weapons in their hands, to more complex communication and vehicular systems, is evaluated in an operational setting in order to ensure it is both operationally effective and operationally suitable. The end result is dependable gear that works like it is supposed to, when it is supposed to, in combat.

## MARINE CORPS NETWORK OPERATIONS & SECURITY COMMAND

The mission of the Marine Corps Network Operations and Security Center is to direct global network operations and defense of the Marine Corps Enterprise Network and provides technical leadership to facilitate seamless information exchange in support of Marine and Joint Forces operating worldwide.

The MCNOSC is the Corps' enterprise net-

work operations center and serves as the Marine component to U.S. Strategic Command's Joint Task Force for Global Network Operations. The MCNOSC is responsible for operations involving all aspects of the Marine Corps Enterprise Network. The MCEN provides the Corps with connectivity to defend network and mainframe services essential for accomplishing every day tasks. From the MCNOSC Operations Center, personnel monitor network operations 24x7 through an array of strategically positioned sensors to ensure the availability and security of the network. The Operations Center monitors three major areas of the MCEN: threats and vulnerabilities, Information Technology systems status and performance and Joint and USMC deployed operations. The MCNOSC is also the Marine Corps' point guard in the implementation of the DOD/JTF-GNO NetOps Concept of Operations, the "way ahead" for future DOD Network Operations.

## MARINE CORPS INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITY

The Marine Corps Intelligence Activity is the Marine Corps only service-level intelligence center. Although having Marines stationed in locations worldwide, MCIA is primarily located at Quantico, Virginia and Fort Meade and Suitland, Maryland. MCIA's mission is complex despite its relatively small workforce and the level of tailoring and adaptation required for its products is substantial. MCIA is unique among service production centers as a large percentage of MCIA's effort supports the operating force.

MCIA strives to tailor its intelligence production toward specific operational needs. It produces more than 25 different types of intelligence products and services. MCIA leverages the analysis and analysts of other national or defense intelligence agencies or organizations, as needed, to meet the needs of more than 570 different customers including all branches of service, government entities, and coalition partners. MCIA provides Headquarters, Marine Corps; Marine Corps components; and others with threat assessments, estimates, and intelligence for service planning and decision making; intelligence support for doctrine and force structure development, systems, and equipment acquisition; war-gaming; and training and education. MCIA supports operating force requirements for predeployment planning, training, and



exercises. • MCIA provides intelligence support to the acquisition community as well. The primary customers for intelligence support to acquisitions are the Marine Corps Combat Development Command and Marine Corps Systems Command both located here on Quantico. •

MCIA is fully integrated into the Department of Defense Intelligence Analysis Program. • Through this program, MCIA is poised to provide expeditionary warfare intelligence to support any national, theater, or operational command in the U.S. Armed Forces. • Thus, MCIA and its reserve production elements support not only the Marine Corps, but also defense planners, defense and national security policymakers, decision makers, theater commanders, and operational warfighters. • MCIA focuses its efforts on the Marine Corps supporting establishment and fulfilling its service-level responsibilities to the Department of Defense Intelligence Community. •

The Global War on Terrorism blurred the distinction between established boundaries of national decision making and military operations. Regardless, senior policymakers often require significantly different intelligence than military consumers. • MCIA supports both national and military customers. • Some of these efforts include route and hydrology studies; reach-back services, liaison officer deployments; coordination of support from multiple, national-level intelligence organizations; and tailored products with specific mis-

sion focus for requirements satisfaction. MCIA provides critical intelligence support giving Marine forces a tactical advantage on the battlefield.

The Marine Corps Intelligence Activity includes three subordinate commands. • They are, the Marine Cryptologic Support Battalion, the Production and Analysis Company, and the Counterintelligence / Human Intelligence Support Company. •

The Marine Cryptologic Support Battalion provides trained, deployable Marines to conduct signals intelligence and information assurance activities supporting the Marine Air-Ground Task Force, naval, and national level missions. The Battalion maintains operational and administrative control of SIGINT Marines at various National Security Agency sites around the world and provides operational surge capabilities through specific, short-term, general support to the operating forces.

The Production and Analysis Company provides tailored scientific and technological, imagery, geospatial, and all-source intelligence products and services to operating forces and the Intelligence Community.

The Counterintelligence/Human Intelligence Support Company provides tailored, service-level, CI and HUMINT support to MCIA, expeditionary forces, and the supporting establishment. • As the Marine Corps service-level CI/HUMINT organization, the company manages CI and HUMINT collection requirements for the Marine Corps. •

## JOINT NON-LETHAL WEAPONS DIRECTORATE

Since 1996, the Joint Non-Lethal Weapons Program has been overseeing the research and development of non-lethal weapons and stimulating non-lethal requirements. The JNLWP makes program recommendations to the Services regarding fielding of non-lethal weapons and assists in the development of training programs. The Joint Non-Lethal Weapons Directorate, Bldg. 3097, manages the day-to-day operations of the program. The Commandant of the Marine Corps serves as the Executive Agent for the DOD's Non-Lethal Weapons Program.

The Department of Defense defines non-lethal weapons as "weapons, devices and munitions that are explicitly designed and primarily employed to incapacitate targeted personnel or materiel immediately, while minimizing fatalities, permanent injury to personnel and undesired damage to property in the target area or environment. Non-lethal weapons are intended to have reversible effects on personnel and materiel."

As U.S. troops overseas continue to face the daily challenges of irregular warfare, non-lethal weapons are providing critical escalation-of-force tools in situations where U.S. operating forces have only seconds to distinguish between adversaries and innocent civilians and act accordingly. Non-lethal weapons provide escalation-of-force options for warfighters, minimizing casualties and collateral damage.

Non-lethal weapons have numerous counter-personnel and counter-materiel applications across the range of military operations, providing capabilities that assist operating forces in discerning intent, delaying and deterring individuals, and discriminating targets in a variety of force application and force protection missions. Possible scenarios include checkpoint and port security missions; convoy security; situations where enemies are using civilians as human shields; maintaining order during humanitarian relief missions; and situations where adversaries' military capabilities are collocated with civilian infrastructure.

Many non-lethal weapons are currently fielded, with research efforts ongoing on a host of developing technologies that will help fill many of the non-lethal capability gaps the Services have identified. Fielded non-lethal weapons include blunt-impact munitions, optical warning and distraction devices, acoustic hailing devices, vehicle arresting devices,



flash-bang grenades and munitions and temporary incapacitation devices, such as human electro-muscular incapacitation devices.

The Marine Corps Air Facility traces a long history of aviation service to Quantico

and the Marine Corps as the first Marine Corps Air Station dating back to 1918. Since October 1992, MCAF has belonged to commander, Marine Corps Air Bases East, headquartered at MCAS Cherry Point, N.C.

Today, under direction, MCAF provides support to Marine Helicopter Squadron One, service to the fleet, and hospitality for important events such as the Modern Day Marine Corps Exposition, Congressional Marine Day, and the Joint Staff's Force Protection Equipment Demonstration.

### *MARINE HELICOPTER SQUADRON ONE*

Marine Helicopter Squadron One was established in 1947 at Quantico to pioneer an entirely new concept in air operations: to evaluate and test in coordination with the Landing Force Development Center the theory of transporting Marines to a battle zone by helicopter. From this early mission, the Operational Test and Evaluation Department of HMX-1 has evolved into the operational test activity for new helicopter systems and products destined

for the Fleet Marine Force. HMX-1 flies the CH-46E, CH-53E, the VH-60 and the VH-3 helicopters in support of its mission. HQMC also tasks HMX-1 with providing helicopter lift support to MCCDC schools and various VIP's in the Washington area. The most visible mission HMX-1 performs is presidential support. Company D, 4th Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion is located at Camp Upshur, Quantico. The unit consists of approximately 136 enlisted Reserve Marines and five reserve Marine officers with medical support provided by 10 reserve Navy corpsmen. The unit maintains six variants of the Light Armored Vehicle, the primary vehicle being the LAV-25.

The Northeast regional office is responsible for providing audit services to all NAF activities located at Quantico, Henderson Hall, HQMC, and Marine Barracks clubs and recreation funds located in Kansas, Missouri, New York, Marine Barracks Washington, D.C., and Europe. In an age of rapidly advancing technology, the protection of classified naval information from unauthorized disclosure is vital to national security, as is the safeguarding of naval material from damage or destruction.

The role of the Naval Criminal Investigative Service in this regard is a dual one: to assist the Navy and Marine Corps in protecting their assets and to apprehend those who would allow them to be compromised.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

**Directory.** This directory is an authorized UNOFFICIAL publication of Marine Corps Base Quantico, Marine Corps Combat Development Command, and tenant activities.

**Organization.** The directory is composed of five major sections. These sections include General Information, Alphabetical Listing, MCB Quantico, MCCDC, and Tenant Organizations, which include M&RA and MARCORSSCOM.

**Telephone Service.** Long distance telephone service for MCB Quantico is provided by FTS 2001 service. FTS 2001 service is accessed by dialing "99+1" followed by the 10 digit telephone number of the station that you are calling. FTS

2001 long distance charges will be identified in a locally produced monthly bill. FTS 2001 service is for OFFICIAL CALLING ONLY. Non-official long distance calls will be made either with a personal calling card, collect, or on a public pay telephone.

**Telephone Installation and Repair Services.** Telephone installation and repair service at the Command is provided by civilian contractors. Installations, relocations, disconnections, and systems redesign are coordinated by the Telecommunication Network Branch, Communication Electronics Division. This work requires that a telephone service request be submitted. This request must include the following information:

■ A point of contact: name & telephone number, building & room location.

■ Telephone numbers and intercom numbers of each telephone involved.

All requests for service are to be submitted to the TeleComm Net Branch via respective organization Telephone Control Officer. Allow sufficient time for approval and scheduling of work. Telephone repair services are available by dialing 784-2500. Please identify the telephone number where the problem exists and the type of problem, if known.

**Quarters Telephone Service.** Barracks residents who desire telephone service should contact the contracted service provider by calling 800-893-2018. The TeleComm Network Branch is not authorized to coordinate telephone service.

### WARNING

DSN calls at this Command fall under the following restriction: "DOD telephone communications systems are provided for the transmission of official government information only and are subject to telephone communication security monitoring and telephone communications management monitoring at all times." Telephone Monitoring: MCO P2066.1 and MCB Order P2831.1A.

### PERSONAL CALLS FROM GOVERNMENT PHONES

Regarding the proper use of DON telephones. The Navy is being obligated to spend substantial funds for telephone calls made for other than official business. In accordance with MCO P2066.1B, the following guidelines are established for proper use of telephone service by government employees:

The use of Government assets, including the use of DOD telephones, is limited by SECNAVINST 5215 to the conduct of official business. GSA has amended 41 CFR Part 201-38 NOTAL to authorize federal agencies to permit federal employees conducting official business, to make reasonable personal use of government base telecommunications systems for emergency calls or calls the agency determines are necessary in the interest of the government.

Official business calls include personal, local, and long distance calls if they do not adversely affect performance of the employee's official duties or the mission of the employee's organization, are of reasonable duration and frequency, and reasonably cannot be made at another time. Personal calls cannot result in a charge to the government even if the employee intends to reimburse the government. Thus, a personal long-distance call must be to an 800-TOLL free number, charged to an employee's home telephone number or another non-government number, collect, or charged to a personal telephone credit card. Additionally, calls for information assistance may not be made if a charge results to the government telephone.

NOTE: Reimbursing the government for an unauthorized call does not exempt violators from disciplinary action. Use of DOD Command and Control Networks (DSN, FTS-2001, etc.) is not authorized for personal calls.

Examples of permissible types of personal calls include checking on a family member, making or canceling personal appointments, checking on the status of home or auto repairs, and notifying family of overtime requirements or other changes in schedules.

If base operator intervention is required to complete the call, the local commander may use discretion of this policy and shall publish guidelines.

There have been no changes to existing policy regarding DOD employees making personal calls while on official travel to a temporary duty location. Any change regarding employees on official travel will be reflected in the joint travel regulations.

Use of DOD telephones to place calls to 1-900 numbers and similar toll calls are strictly prohibited. Activities providing telephone service managers, and the chain of command should make every effort to block or prevent such calls. Supervisors of government employees, both military and civilian, are responsible for:

■ Ensuring that authorized use does not become abused.

■ Ensuring all government billed toll and long distance calls are for "OFFICIAL BUSINESS" except in case of an emergency, when prior authori-

ization may be granted for a personal call. To preclude abuse, supervisors should maintain records of all toll and long distance calls and then verify against actual bills.

■ Investigating all unauthorized calls and ensuring monetary repayment equivalent to billed charges and processing costs are collected from identified offenders. Appropriate administrative or disciplinary action should be taken when necessary.

■ Review and verify all bills for telephone service prior to payment.

## DEFINITIONS

**Station to Station.** These are calls from one military number on base to another military number on base.

**Base Operator:** This is the MCCDC Base Operator.

**911 on Base.** This number will call the Fire Department on base only. The Fire Dept. will contact military police if situation warrants.

**Toll Calls.** Any calls that are outside of the local calling area and are not placed on FX or DSN lines.

**Overseas Calls.** Any calls direct dialed or operator assisted that do not use the DSN network.

## FEATURE DIALING INSTRUCTIONS

The instructions given below are for telephones without specialized buttons. **Hook Flash** - the mechanism on a phone's receiver cradle that allows the line to be disconnected. To utilize the hook flash feature, depress the button and quickly release it. **Hook Flash/\*78**

**3-Way Calling** - allows a station to have a three party call of military numbers only. **Hook Flash/Dial number/Hook Flash**

**Last Number Redial** - will redial the last number. **Dial \*73**

**Ring Again** - notifies a station when a busy military number becomes idle and places the call. **Hook Flash/\*79**

The following features must be requested using a Work Request. Instructions for their use will be available when request is filled.

**Call Pick-up** - allows a station to answer any incoming call to any other number in that pickup group. **Dial \*75**

**Call Waiting Basic** - alerts a station that it is being called by a third party from off the base.

**Call Transfer Intragroup** - allows a station to transfer a call to another station in the customer group. MCCDC military numbers from our customer group.

**Speed Call Long List** - allows a number to program up to thirty (30) numbers. These may be commercial or DSN.

**Speed Call Short List** - allows a number to program up to ten (10) numbers. These may be commercial or DSN.

**Call Forward Intra** - allows a number to forward all calls to another number within the pickup group.

**Call Forward /Don't Answer** - if the called phone number does not answer within a specified time (3-5 rings), CDF forwards the call to a designated number.
