Overview: The Protective Overgarment (POG) can be worn over the outer garment by all Marines. It is worn as a single-piece article with three interoperable components capable of individual adjustment. The POG provides fragmentary protection to the groin and perineum equal to the standard body armor.

Features: The POG provides protection from fragmentation for the groin and perineum in explosive events for Marines. The POG can be worn on the back of the belt and, when needed unrolled, passed between the legs and attached to the front of the Marine's belt.

Components: Carrier Front, Carrier Center, Carrier Rear, Front Armor, Center Armor, Rear Armor
